## Planning to Transfer

### Questions Every Transfer Student Should Ask

- What grade do I have to earn in a course for it to transfer? Will a "D" transfer?
- What GPA do I need to transfer?
- Will my GPA at my old school transfer?
- How will I know how many credits transferred and how the credits fit into a major?
- When is the deadline for transfer applications?
- What is the maximum number of credits I can transfer?
- Are certain courses required in order to transfer?
- If courses do not transfer, what happens to them?

### What do College and Universities look for from Transfer Applicants?

Grades in college courses are by far the most important factor in transfer admission decisions.

Curriculum is also an important consideration, generally speaking remedial courses do not transfer

Other factors include: essay or writing sample, work/extracurricular activities, interview, recommendations and students' interest in attending.



RISD is one of the oldest and best-known colleges of art and design in the U.S. Each year approximately 2,300 students from around the world pursue a creative, studio-based education at RISD, which offers rigorous bachelor's and master's degree programs in 19 architecture, design, fine arts and art education majors. The college is located in Providence, Rhode Island.


